

Breeze

With TimeSavers/ConvertFMnewlink, **newlink** hypertext markers can be used to create named destinations without the **m8.newlink.** prefixes (**mN.8.newlink.** prefixes when converting a book to PDF, N = document number in book).

In the hypertext marker, add a user-defined identifier (default: **TMS**), followed by a space and the named destination you wish to have in the PDF. For example:
newlink TMS Breeze

Inspiration

Named destinations without a variable prefix may be useful when you need to specify HTML links to specific destinations in a PDF file stored in a web site (such as `http://www.abc.com/guide.pdf#Inspiration`) or to refer to named destinations in JavaScript functions.

The `ConvertFMnewlink` function also enables the creation of QuickAccess Bookmarks (with hypertext markers such as `newlink BMK FunctionName`)

TradeWinds

Starting with TimeSavers 3.5, ConvertFMnewlink also affects link targets used by gotolink/openlink markers. A `gotolink abc.fm:TMS XYZ` hypertext marker, for example, will create a link with a target destination of `XYZ` (and not `m8.newlink.XYZ` or `mN.8.newlink.XYZ`) in the `abc.pdf` file.

This is useful for cross-document linking when a team of writers uses a set of FrameMaker documents which are not available directly (eg stored locally) and cross-references cannot be used.

FourWinds

In the full version of Acrobat, select [Windows > Destinations > Scan Document](#), to see the named destinations in this PDF, defined through FrameMaker's hypertext markers (distilled with TimeSavers/ConvertFMnewlink)
